About Today's Guest Duet

Cellist Helen Newby continually seeks ways to expand the technical and expressive boundaries of her instrument through close collaboration with other innovative performers and composers. She received her Bachelor's

in Music from the Oberlin Conservatory and her Master's in Cello Performance at the San Francisco Conservatory of Music. Her principal cello teachers have included Darrett Adkins, Jennifer Culp and Rachael Lonergan. Helen's passion for collaboration and experimentation has led her to premiere many new works by



both emerging and established composers. Her premiere solo album, featuring commissions by contemporary American composers, is set to release in early 2017.

Helen is a founding member of string trio Chartreuse, string quartet Amaranth, jazz sextet deturtle, and experimental noise quartet HK&tCS. She additionally performs with the San Francisco Contemporary Music Players. In addition to an active career as a performer, Helen is equally dedicated to teaching. She maintains a private studio in Berkeley and is on faculty at The Crowden School.



Oakland-based **pianist**, Anne Rainwater is a dexterous musician, known for her vibrant interpretations of works from J.S. Bach to John Zorn. Recognized for her "boldly assertive rhetoric" (San Francisco Examiner), she appears as a soloist, accompanist, chamber musician, and educator. She holds a Bachelor's in Music from the Oberlin Conservatory and a Master of Music in Contemporary Performance from the Manhattan School of Music. Recent performances include solo and collaborative shows at the Center for

New Music, Switchboard Music Festival, Forte House, and with the Nevada County Composers Commission and sfSound. Anne also teaches privately at her home studio in Oakland and at International High School in San Francisco. Anne joined Voci as the ensemble's accompanist in Fall 2016.

About Voci

Voci is an auditioned, non-profit, volunteer women's vocal ensemble dedicated to musical excellence in the performance of both new and innovative music, as well as treasured repertoire, within the classical choral tradition. Voci champions music written for and by women. Now celebrating our 25th season, we enjoy an established reputation with Bay Area audiences and critics as one of the finest choral groups in the area.

Voci is delighted to have Mitchell Covington as our Guest Conductor this spring, while Artistic Director Anne Hege is on maternity leave. Mitchell was Voci's founding Artistic Director from 1991-1995; his appointment provides a wonderful closing of the circle on Voci's first 25 years.

Voci Guest Conductor, Mitchell Covington is an accomplished choral and orchestral conductor who has led many exquisite ensembles over a 30-year career, directing choirs and orchestras in performances in the United States and throughout Europe. He led Voci as its founding director from 1991–1995, directed the Bay Choral Guild from 1995–2001, and led a seven-choir music program with over 300 participants at First Presbyterian Church of Berkeley for 23 years.

Mitchell is also an award-winning composer, working in the San Francisco Bay Area. His compositions include works for orchestra, chorus, stage, film, television and video games. He has been awarded the Aaron Copland Foundation Meet the Composer Award, a regional Emmy award, and several film festival awards and prizes. His scores have appeared in international film festivals and on prime-time, nationally broadcast television, and several of his compositions are published by major U.S. publishers.

Mitchell received a Masters degree in Conducting from the University of Southern California in Los Angeles, graduating with honors. At USC he studied choral conducting with Rod Eichenberger, Orchestral Conducting with Hanz Beer and Choral Arranging with Morten Lauridsen. He currently serves on the Executive Board of the American Choral Director's Association-Western Division, and is the Artistic Director of the Duruflé in Paris Choral Festival. He frequently serves as guest conductor and clinician for church and high school choirs throughout the San Francisco Bay Area, and as adjudicator and clinician for choir festivals and conferences.
